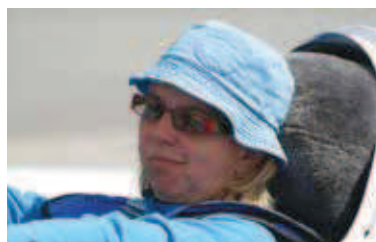

Normally one can hardly make a valid comparison between the number of outlandings – permit me to call them with the eloquent French expression “Vaches” (go to the cows) at the different locations of the every two years Women’s World Gliding Championships. Why? because METEO dictates its cruel law of imposing the day tasks! With the risk of increasing the length of the day task after one day of everybody home. In Arboga the very changing meteo pattern had great influence on the choice of tasks- and of course the results.

Adding to that many pilots complained about the small surfaces of most possible outlanding fields... quite an exception that (glorious ?) day when not less than eleven pilots landed on the same field. Nevertheless, here are the “naked” numbers, leaving to the reader his (her) own opinion, considering number of pilots and tasks.

MEDALLIST LADIES... in the shadow in Arboga 2011

When on the first standard class task Jana Veprekova (CZ) finished second after Joanna Biedermann, this could very well be the start of more successes of this successful Czech pilot. Participation in Arboga was number 14 for Jana, ever present since 1985. With a palmares of 1 gold(2005 in Klix), 3 silver (1999 Leszno, 2007 Romorantin, 2009 Szegeed, and 3 bronze medals (1989 Orel, 1991 Husbands

Bosworth, 1997 Prievidza), she was not going to be invisible in Arboga. But following days, one looked in vain for repetition of her former successes. Tasks too short? Thermals too weak? But that was the fate striking all other competitors. Jana finished 9th on 16 in standard class. In the same standard class the same fate seemed to strike another famous medallist woman: Gillian Spreckley (GB).

For her 11th uninterrupted participation she had impressive credentials to present: 2 gold (2001 Pocunai, 2007 Romorantin), and 3 silver (1997 Prievidza, 1999 Leszno, 2005 Klix) medals. Her next best ranking was 4th last time in Szegeed 2009 and everybody expected to see her improve that result. In vain. Did she miss her husband-and-team-captain Brian Spreckley? - although the British team captain in Arboga, Melissa Jenkins did quite

a good job. Short tasks? Too weak thermals? But again they were the same for everybody... Gillian simply said: "I made the wrong decisions". She finished 14th on 16 in standard class.

I can't very well "forget" to mention Valentyna Toporova (UKR) in this little group of reputed medallists. Arboga was her 13th participation. She started her career 1987 in Shumen, got her first gold in 1991 in Husbands Bosworth and after silver in 1997 in Prievidza she got gold again in 1999 Leszno.

The new century was not so victorious for her... maybe Arboga 2011 would mean revival. But there one had to wait till the last day she became third -to even realize Valentyna was indeed present in Arboga. Unfortunately, fate was as cruel to her as to both her famous medallists She finished 12th on 13 in 15 m class.

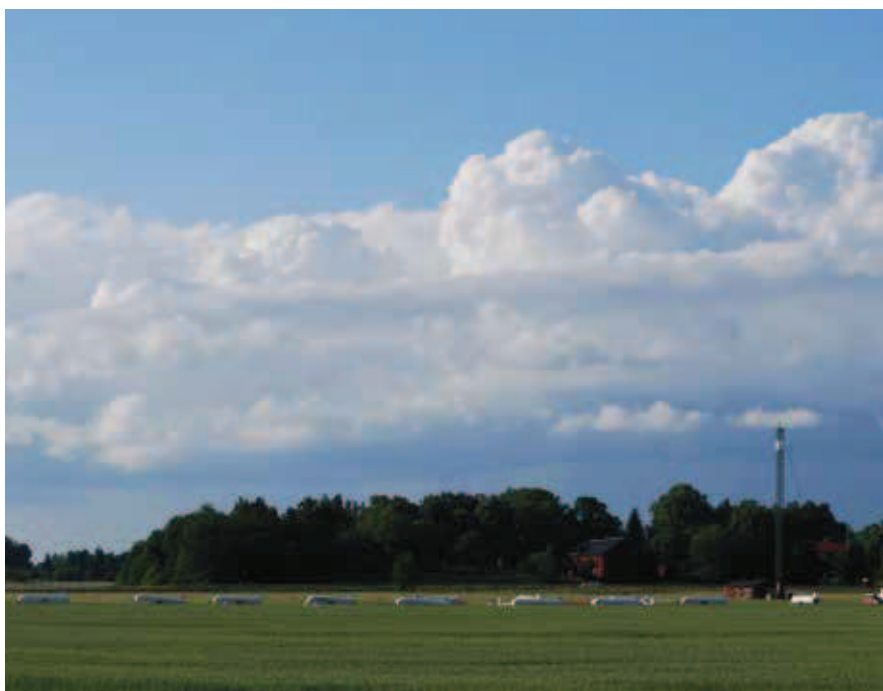
Let us hope to meet these 3 outstanding pilots – and – persons – again in Issoudun 2013, taking up their good medal habit!

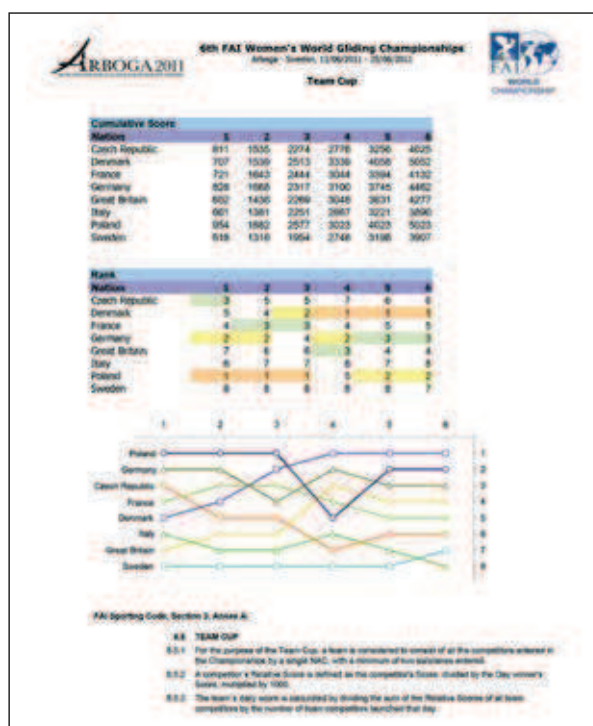


TEAM CUPS - ARBOGA 2011

It is quite remarkable that after 3 day tasks Poland was still in the lead- with Joanna Biedermann and Marta Najfeld. And then: slide down all the way of Joanna, outlanding, getting 65 points on a 1000 points day! Young Marta Najfeld stayed near the podium all the time.

The second half of the championships Denmark kept the lead till the very end.

Russia, Oukraine, Hungary, Finland entered only one pilot, thus not to be considered for the Team Cup.
